ANNUAL BENEFITS INCREASES 2020/2021

The Compensation Fund Assessments and Benefits Committee met in a special meeting that was held on the 23rd October 2019 in order to consider benefit increases that should be recommended for approval by the Minster for 2020/2021.

- 1. The recommendation of the Board is detailed below to increase all earnings benefits with 5.6% and expenses benefits with 4.6% as from 1 April 2020.
- This will result in pension's payable by the Compensation Fund to be increased by 4.6%.
